We Are Each Other’s Harvest: Solidarity at the End of the World

The book rethinks the theological and philosophical concept of “solidarity” in the face of the immense challenges of the Anthropocene, drawing the important, but often hazily-defined concept into sharper view through multidisciplinary engagements with (a) the history of race as a biopolitical ecology, (b) its afterlives in present-day climate science, and (c) its relation to evolutionary anthropology’s comparative studies of human and nonhuman animals’ cognition and behavior.
